The Allied Van Lines Magnet States report shows trends in U.S. migration patterns using internal data to compare inbound and outbound moves by Allied Van Lines, one of the world's largest moving companies. Texas topped the list as the most magnetic state, with a gain of 1,973 households.

California, Oregon and Washington State all showed significant pull for new moves, and both California and Washington became inbound states in 2014.



Texas Is King — 10 Years as Top Magnet State

2014 marks a full decade of Magnet States dominance for Texas. Others in the top 5 are Florida (2), Arizona (3). South Carolina (4) and Colorado (5).



Shuffling the Bottom of the Deck

Illinois, Pennsylvania, New York, Michigan and New Jersey have the dubious honor as top outbound states

in 2014. Since 2010, the same 5 states have laid claim to the bottom of the list, though in different order. This year, Illinois takes the lead with 1,372 outbound moves.
